Dennis Bayomi graduated from the University of Manitoba with a B.Sc. in computer science and has been with the University's Faculty of Medicine as computer co-ordinator since 1983.

Mary Blackwelder received her MLS degree from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 1978. Since 1980 she has worked at the Medical College of Wisconsin Libraries. She is currently Acting Director, Medical College of Wisconsin, MCW Libraries.

Carole Brault received a bachelors degree in biology from the Université de Sherbrooke and a library science degree from the École de bibliothéconomie de L'Université de Montréal. From 1985 to 1987 she worked at the École Polytechnique de Montréal and since 1988 has been librarian at the Centre de recherche de CHUL (Centre hospitalier de l'Université Laval) in Québec City.

Neil Campbell received his LL.B. from the University of Victoria and his library degree from the University of British Columbia. In 1989 he came to the University of Manitoba as Head, E.K. Williams Law Library.

Barbara Crutchley has worked in the field of research administration for the past twelve years, first at York University and now at the University of Manitoba. As Research Grants Officer, she is responsible for the administration of the University of Manitoba's internal granting programs.

Harry E. Emson qualified in medicine in 1952 with a BM, BCh from Oxford. He came to Canada in 1956 and received certification in General Pathology by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in 1958. From 1975 to 1990 he served as Professor and Head of the Dept. of Pathology in the College of Medicine of the University of Saskatchewan and University Hospital, Saskatoon. Today he continues as Professor of Pathology.

Richard Henning received his M.L.I.S. degree from the University of Wisconsin and after graduation worked briefly as a hospital librarian. Since October 1991 he has been Technology Advisor/Information Systems at the Medical College of Wisconsin, MCW Libraries in Milwaukee.

Ernie Ingles received his M.A. from the University of Calgary and his Masters in

Librarianship from the University of British Columbia. Before taking up his present position of Director of Libraries at the University of Alberta, he was Director of Libraries at the University of Regina, Chief Executive Officer of the Canadian Institute for Historical Microreproductions and Head, Rare Books and Special Collections, University of Calgary.

Eve-Marie Lacroix is chief of the Public Services Division of the National Library of Medicine. She holds a B.S. Chemistry and M.S. Science Information from the Illinois Institute of Technology, Chicago. Prior to joining NLM, she held several positions at CISTI, including Head of the Health Sciences Resource Centre and Head of Information Services.

Joan Leishman was Library Services Coordinator at ICI Canada Inc. (formerly C-I-L Inc. Research Centre) from 1981 to 1990. She is currently Executive Director, Health Science Information Consortium of Toronto, co-ordinating resource sharing among 36 hospital library members and the University of Toronto Library.

Georgina Lewis is currently Preservation Co-ordinator at the University of Manitoba. She received her library degree from Syracuse University and was Preservation Librarian at the University of Alberta before taking up her present position in 1990.






